Treasurer. 10 members of the Executive Committee will also be elected. If a potential nominee is absent, but has previously agreed orally or in writing to be willing to serve, he or she may be placed in nomination. The public is welcome to attend this Convention.

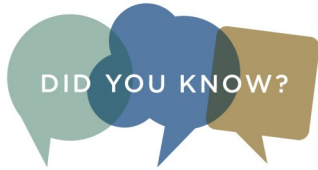

The “Fetal Heart-beat Bill” has passed out of the House Health Committee to advance to a floor vote.

House Bill 77 will ban abortion once a fetal heart-beat is detected. The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) has already stated that it is ready to challenge this bill in court as soon as it is passed. Several groups have expressed their opinion that House Bill 77 is unconstitutional. The ACLU is also opposed to a Tennessee Joint-Resolution Bill introduced by State Rep. Bruce Griffey wanting Tennessee to issue a resolution supporting President Trump’s views on ending birthright citizenship. President Trump has questioned the birthright coverage of children born in this country to parents who entered this country illegally. Gov. Bill Lee has said that he will not oppose an abortion bill because it might be challenged in the courts.

Sen. Marsha Blackburn has voted for the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act to give babies born as a result of failed abortion the same degree of medical care given to those born at the same stage of pregnancy. However, the bill failed to pass due to 44 no votes. Those No Voters believed that this bill would be banning abortions. Polls show that 47% rate themselves as being Pro- Life while another 47% rate themselves as being Pro-Choice. This is the closest this poll has ever been on this issue.
